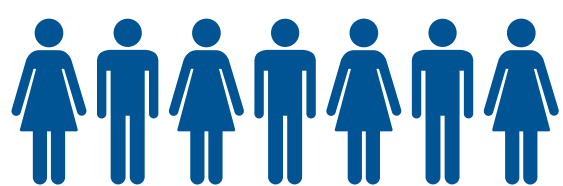

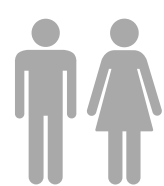


2,510 responses

1/10 is neither

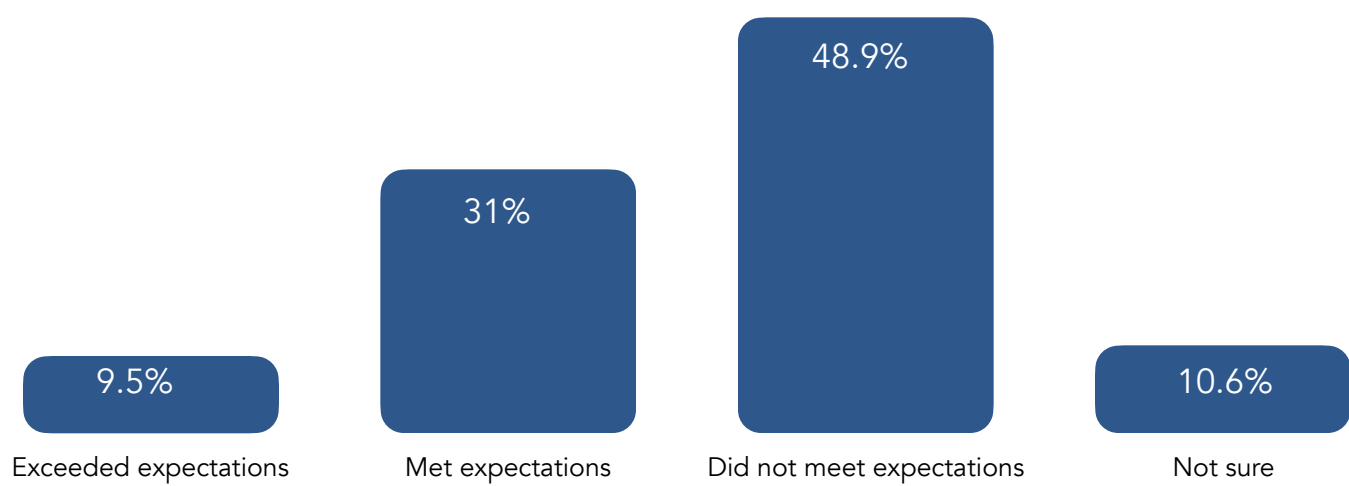
Are any of your children involved in special education, have an individualized education plan (IEP), English as a Second Language (ESL) or other enrichment programs?

Yes 16.1%

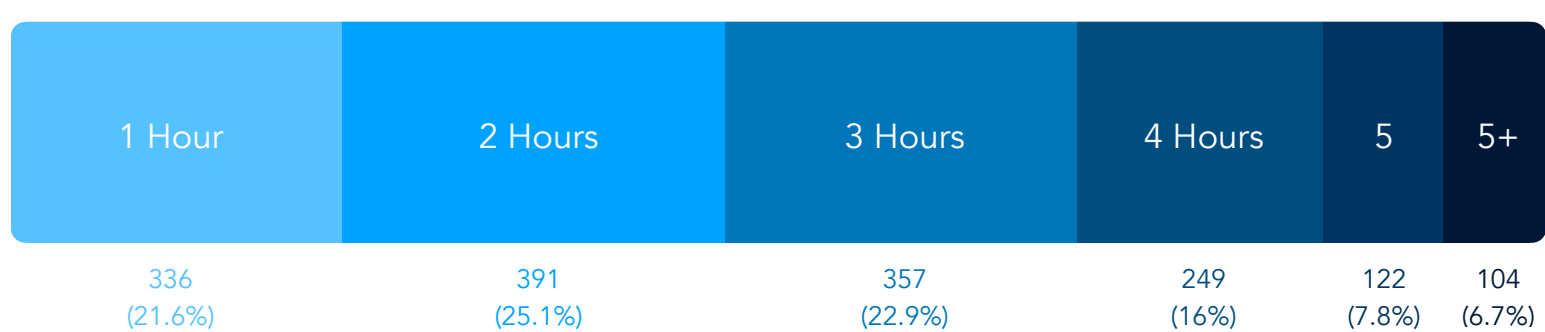

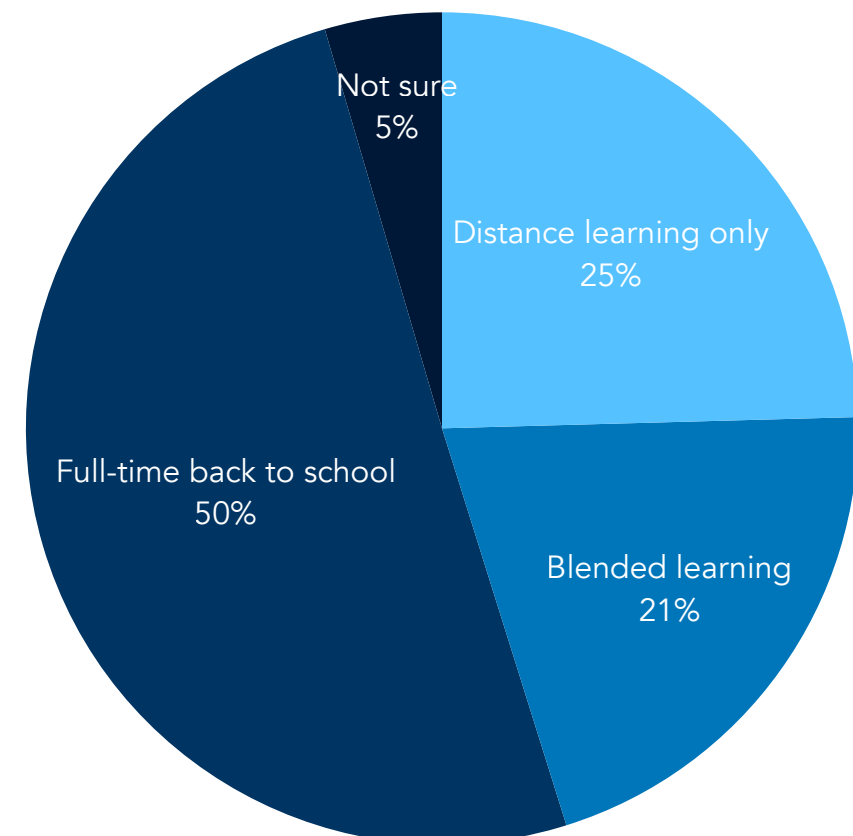
What have been the general impacts to your children while they were out of school in the spring?



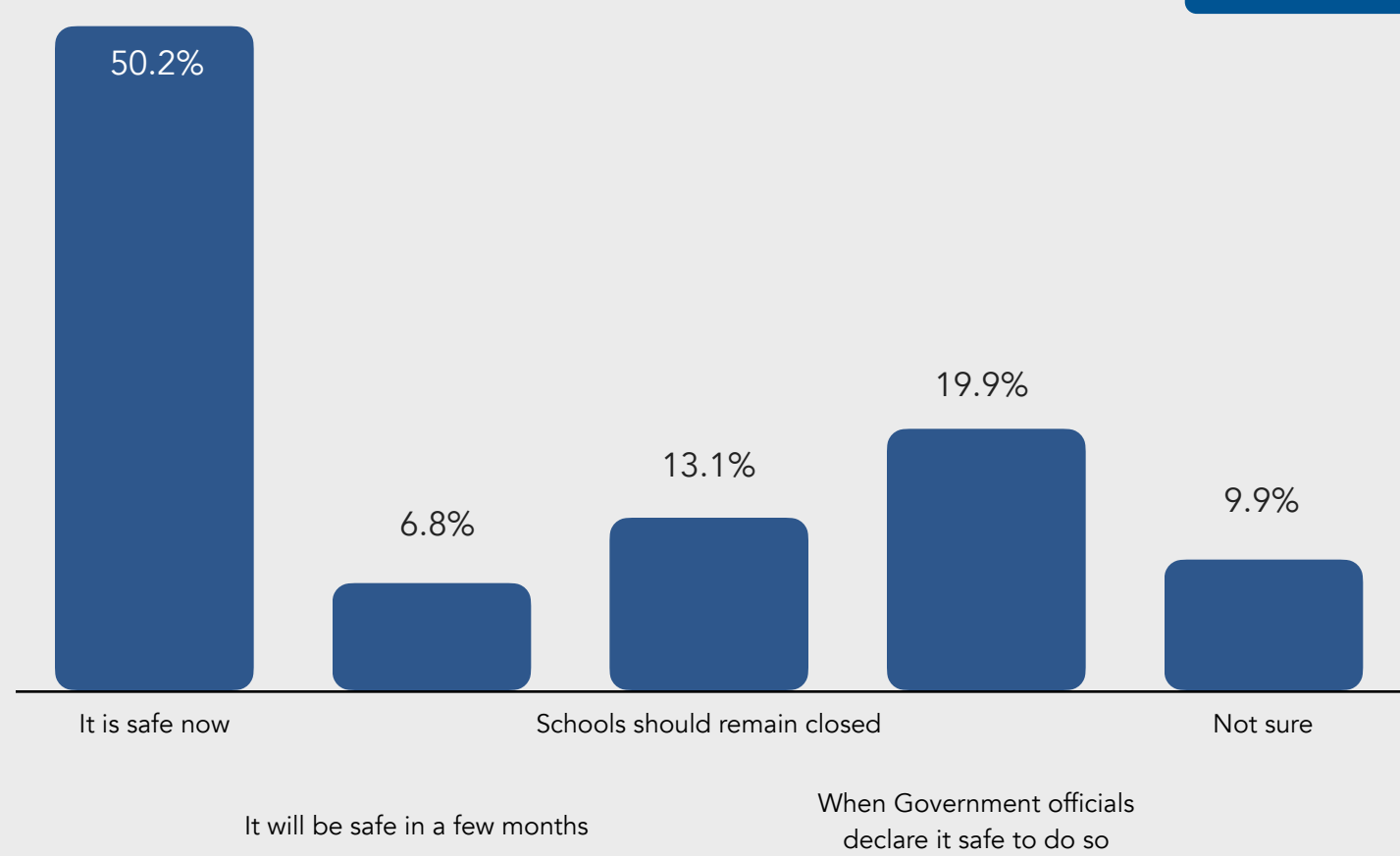
On an average day since schools have closed, how long do your children spend on distance learning while at home?



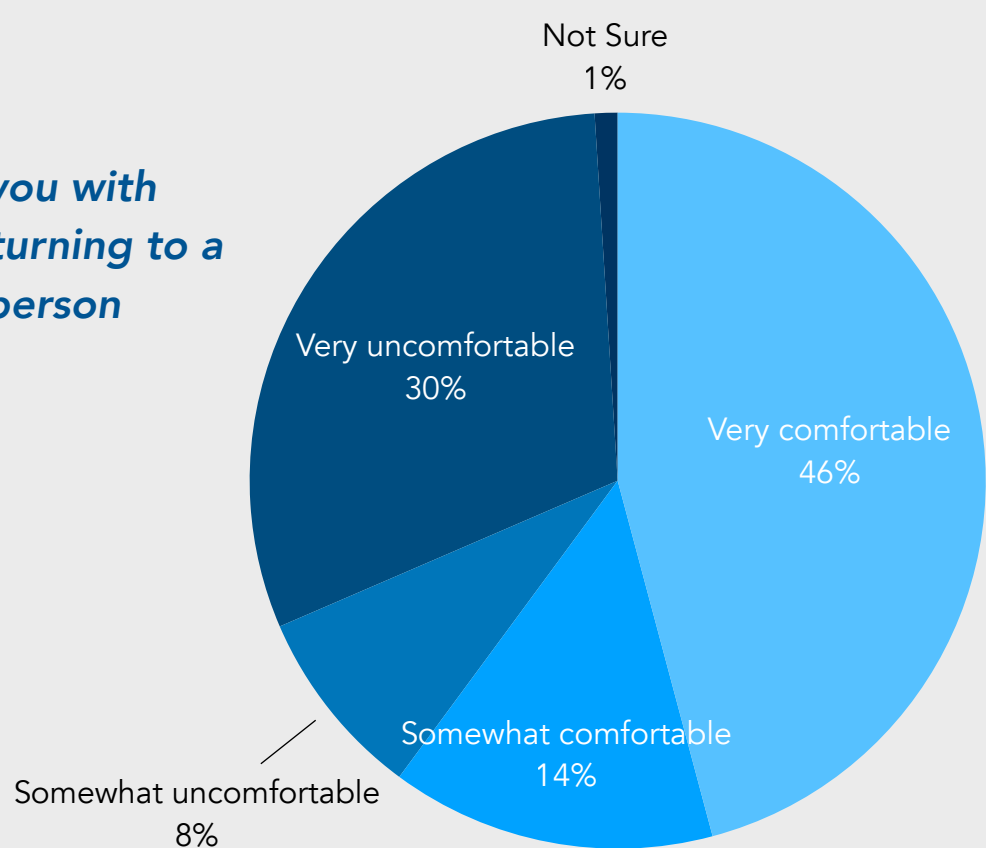

When do you feel it is appropriate to reopen schools with proper health and safety protocols?

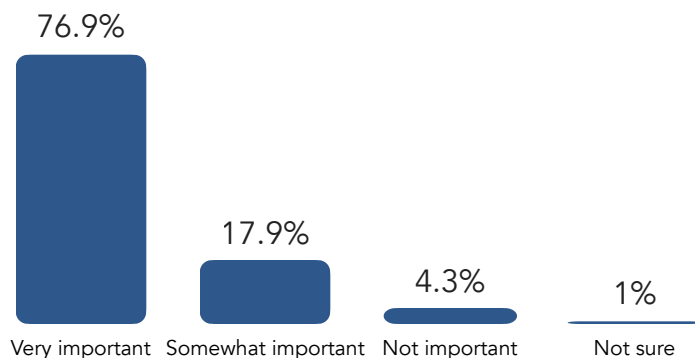


How comfortable are you with children potentially returning to a school building for in-person learning this fall?

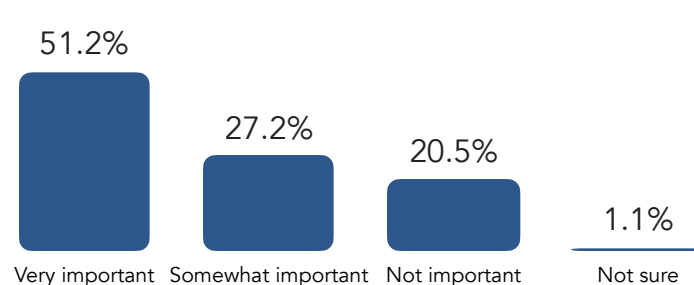


Reopening Strategies

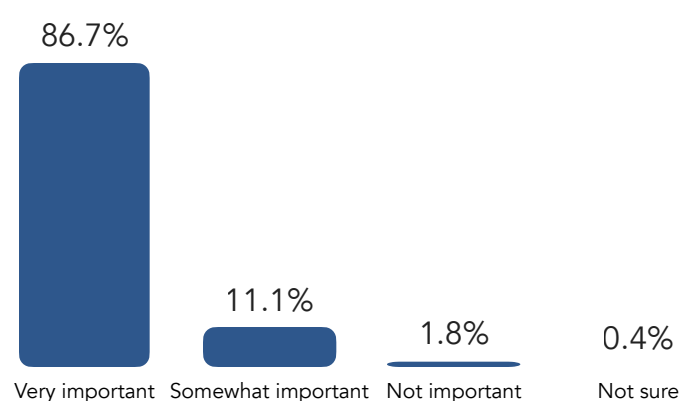
The school is cleaned thoroughly at least once a day.



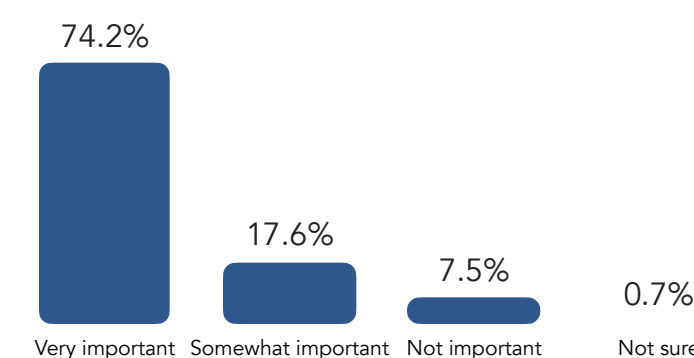
Students/staff maintain distancing throughout the day.



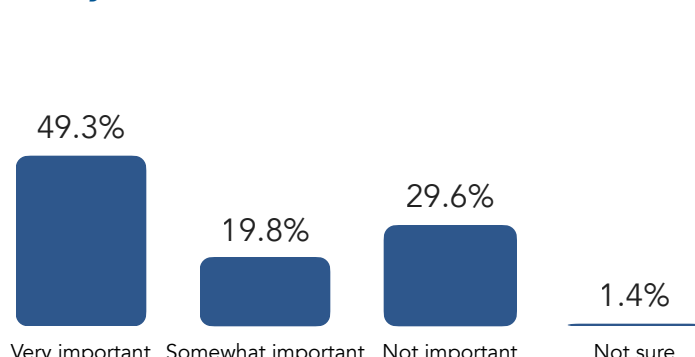
Students/Staff regularly wash hands.



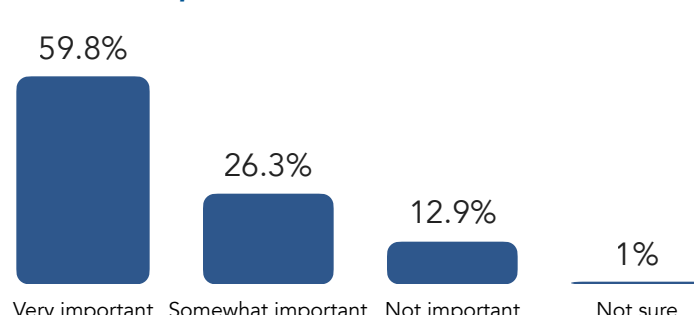
Hand sanitizer is provided to each student/staff.



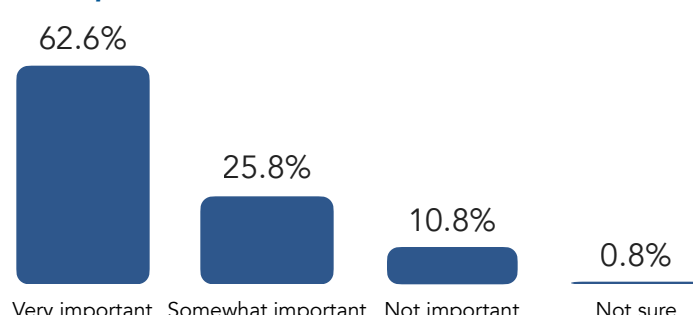
Everyone must wear a mask at all times.



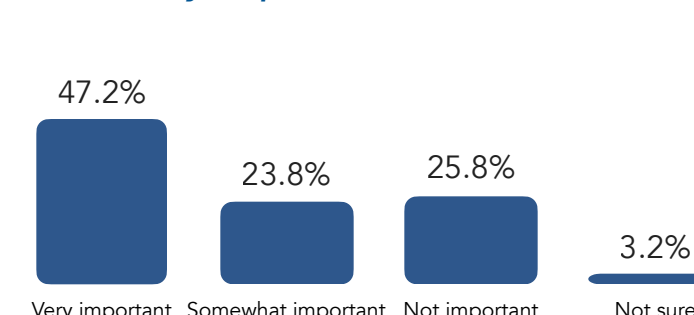
Temperatures are checked for all entering the campus.



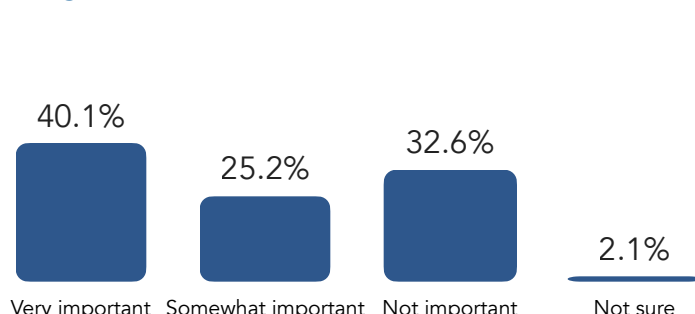
Visitors and volunteers are limited on campus.



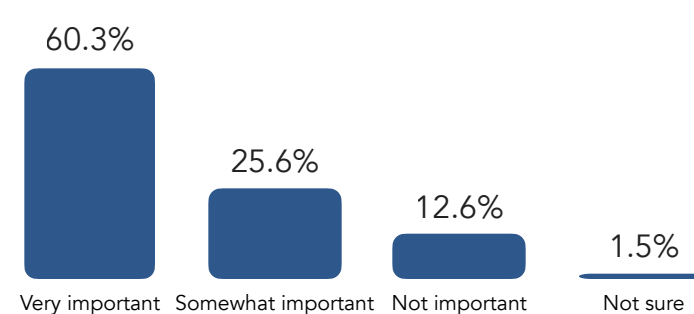
The number of students in each class is reduced by 50 percent.



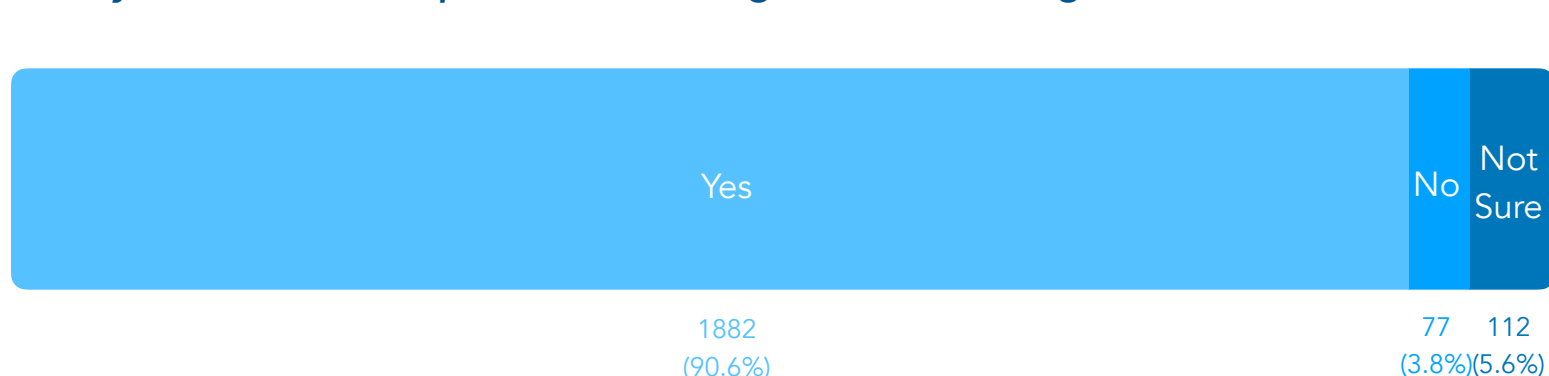
Students only interact with those in their assigned classes.



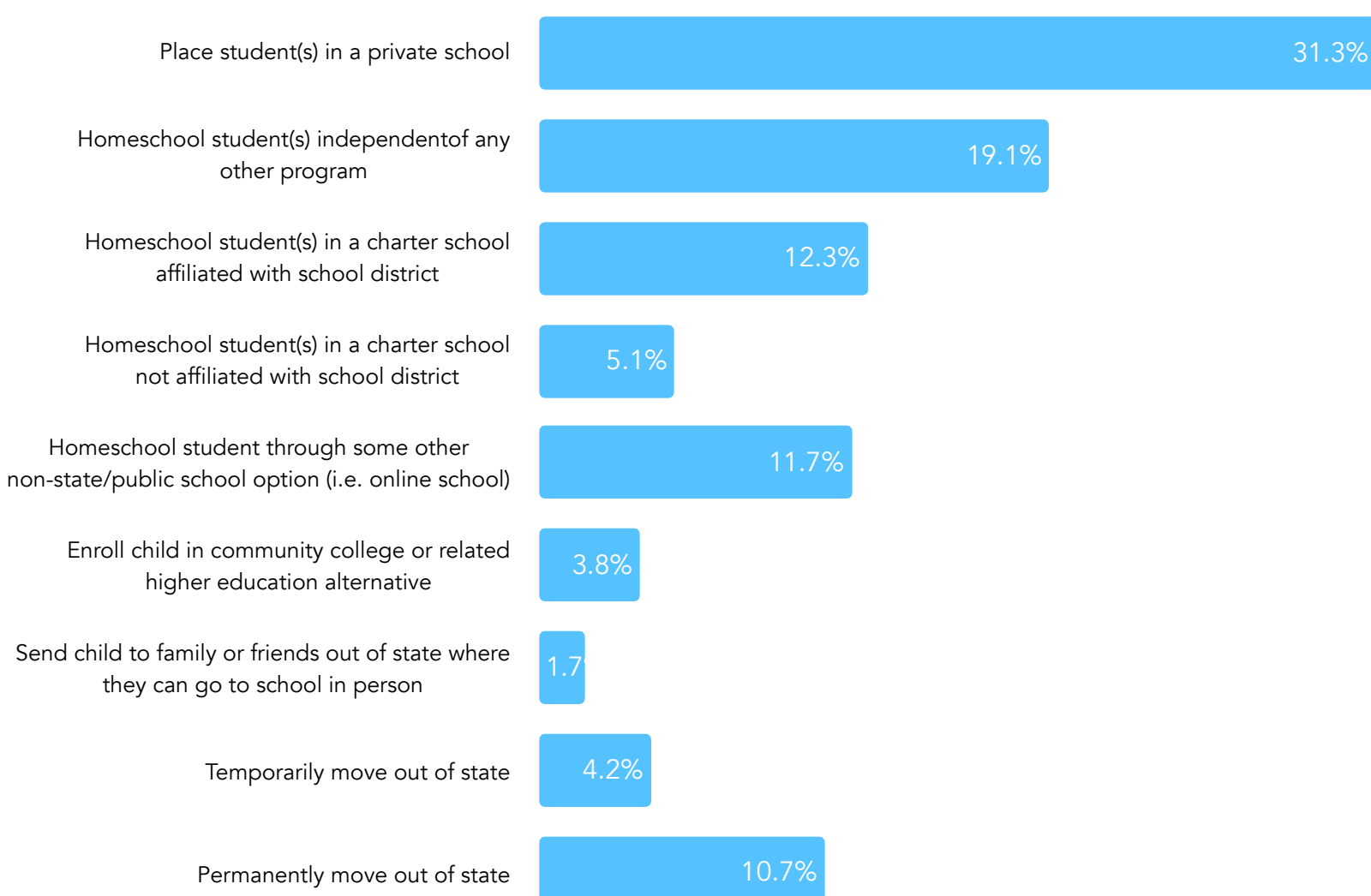
Materials shared among students are cleaned in between use.



If a parent feels uncomfortable sending their child back to school in the fall, should they be allowed the option of continuing distance learning for their child?

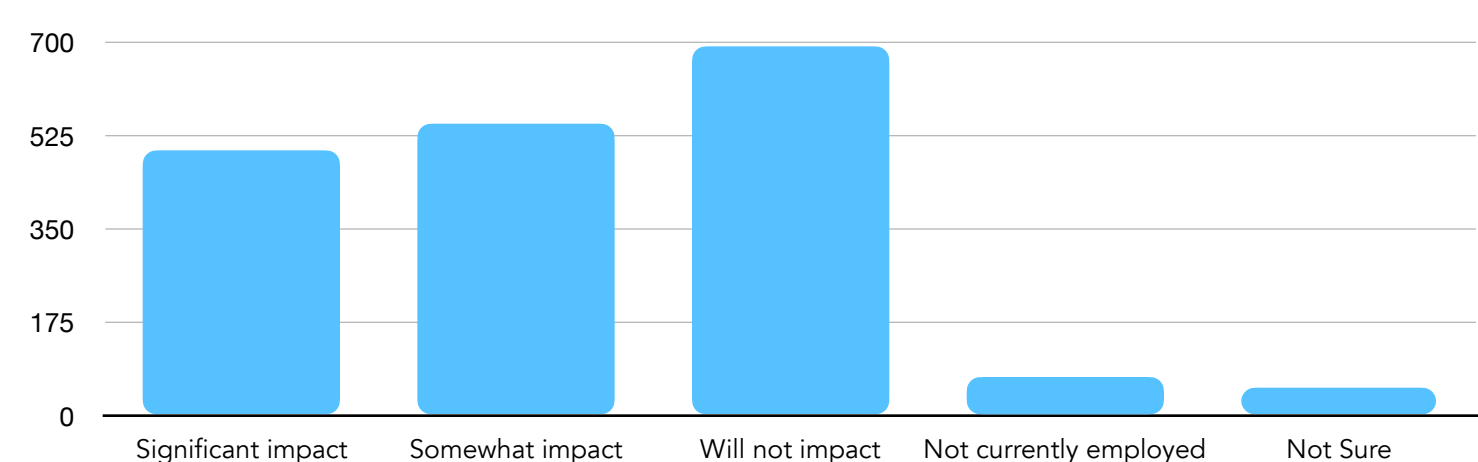


What options are you considering if you do NOT decide to pursue distance learning for your TK-12 student?
